Prior to arriving in Munich, Yelle was Associate Professor at the University of Memphis. He has received fellowships from the University of Toronto, the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, New York University School of Law, and the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation. Among his publications are Explaining Mantras (Routledge, 2003), The Disenchantment of Language (Oxford, 2013), and Semiotics of Religion (Bloomsbury, 2013).
